Past. Present. Future.

From the beginning, in tribute and in service.

On November 10, 1946, the 171st birthday of the US Marine Corps, the Marines'
Memorial Club opened its doors at 609
Sutter Street in San Francisco.

General A. A. Vandegrift, had proposed a "Living Memorial" to Marine casualties from the War in the Pacific. A group of Marines arranged to buy a building owned by a women's club at the corner of Sutter and Mason Streets, whose members they had met through their participation in the wartime WAVES program.

Marines' Memorial Club was to be used for the "convenience and relaxation of Leatherneck officers, enlisted men, veterans and the mothers, fathers and wives of men lost in the service."

Today, the Marines' Memorial is a robust organization that embraces and serves all branches of our armed forces. It is a nurturing space for Gold Star families, a venue for educational events, a provider of college scholarships, and an oasis of military pride and camaraderie in San Francisco's Union Square.

The Marines' Memorial is many things.

We are a museum, library, veterans' club, hotel, restaurant and event space, providing hospitality to our members and supporters. Our success since 1946 has allowed us the privilege of sustaining our unique Living Memorial in the heart of San Francisco.


Our Living Memorial, a gift from the Greatest Generation, is dedicated to the service and sacrifices of all branches of the US Armed Forces who protect our country. Most of all, it serves as a safe and welcoming environment for all to share their unique experience of serving their country.

It is our responsibility to provide the means to support future generations of service members at the revamped Marines' Memorial. 2nd Floor Bar & Lounge

Adjacent to the Marines' Memorial Theatre, The Flying Leatherneck Lounge will be transformed into a Naval Ready Room, featuring:

- · Wooden floors
- Ship-gray wall with a large "6" to honor the history of the USS Bonhomme Richard (LHD-6)
- Officer of the day Ready Room desk serving as the bar
- "Flight Schedule" Drink Menu and updated memorabilia display featuring Naval Aviation artifacts

3rd Floor

As you exit the elevator, step onto the bridge of the USS San Francisco during the Battle of Guadalcanal. This floor honors Naval services members' experience with:

- Wooden ship-like flooring in the foyer
- Displays that tell the story of the Navy, from the historic Six Frigates to the present day, and capture the history of the Coast Guard from 1790 as the Revenue Cutter Service to today's multi-mission Coast Guard



Marines stepping from the elevator into the 4th floor foyer will be transported back to MCRD Receiving and the day they left their civilian lives behind.


- Yellow footprints lead to the recruit's "phone home" box

The Medal of Honor (MoH) is our Nation's highest military decoration, awarded to recognize Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Airmen, Guardians, and Coast Guardsmen who have distinguished themselves by acts of valor. Displays will include:

- · Description and history of the MoH
- Civil War map to include the first MoH awardee, Jacob Parrott
- Spanish American War WWI WWII Korea Vietnam OIF & OEF
- · Recognition of all MoH recipients



Displays in commemoration and appreciation of the veterans of the Korean War and Vietnam War will fill the halls of the 6th floor.

7th Floor

This testament to the Global War on Terror, including Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom, will complement the Tribute Memorial Wall on floor 10M.

8th Floor

Here, we will celebrate the history and accomplishments of the branches of our Armed Forces dedicated to defending the skies and beyond.







The Army is America's first national institution, rooted in the Continental Army, which was formed on 14 June 1775 to fight for independence during the American Revolutionary War. The Army's rich history, told through our collection of images and artifacts, will be the focus of this floor.
